

MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

Why does the Arnprior Public Library require additional staffing?

A cost sharing agreement between Arnprior and McNab/Braeside was reached in 2015. The Library used this taxpayer money and other grants to cover 90% of its budget for that year. The Library made up the reasonable shortfall of the remaining 10% [\$45,000] by its own efforts. These included: allowable fees, late fines and services to the community such as proctoring exams and various fund-raising events.

The Library used these self-generated funds to cover operating costs, including the telephones, photocopying ,the purchase, licensing and maintenance of computers, liability insurance, newspaper and magazine subscriptions, children's program supplies, furniture, postage, staff training, the annual audit and so on.

It should be noted that donations to the Library are not applied to daily operating costs. Donations go to projects specified by donors, whether those donors are individuals or community groups.

Over the course of the 2015 service agreement, Library funding increases have been frozen at 1%. This has not kept pace with the cost of living adjustments for our staff, so the Library is obligated to pay this cost as well. The result has been that the ibrary is running at a spiraling loss requiring greater effort and staff time to work at raising funds.

By 2019, the difference between the funding and the Library's actual cost had increased from 10% in 2015 to 17% in 2019. This amounted to nearly \$84,000 that had to be raised by the library to cover operating costs, cost of living increases for staff as well as books, digital resources and subscriptions. This fundraising also now requires a lot of unpaid staff time.

Out of necessity, the Library has produced many programs which both serve the community and help generate the money needed to keep the library going. We are grateful for the support and co-operation from patrons, community minded groups and local businesses in these efforts. Galas, speaker events, open-mic and film club gatherings and more serve the dual purpose of raising funds and developing the Arnprior Public Library as an excellent cultural and social hub for our community. Unfortunately, our ability to function on this level is severely hampered by our lack of staff. Just a note, it has been 33 years since the last full-time staff appointment.

The Board's request for another full-time librarian is to fulfill the vision of a library that continues to provide quality programming while simultaneously generating the funds needed to serve the growing population of our community.
