

This lecture series is a new initiative that has grown out of a partnership between the Arnprior Regional Health Foundation and the Library. Our aim is to host presentations on a variety of topics, particularly focussing on local input and expertise. The subject matter will be varied and stay tuned for details on upcoming lectures which are scheduled for the first Thursday of each month in the library's main community hall.

On September 6th we welcome ret. Colonel Andrew Nellestyn with a 45 minute presentation on THE ROLE OF CANADA'S MILITARY IN NATION BUILDING, SECURITY AND DEVELOPMENT: The contributions by Canada's military to international peace, security and stability operations and nation building from WWI to Afghanistan are explored through the personal anecdotes of the men and women who served. Extracts from the acclaimed documentary series *THE VETERANS* and the bestseller book *AFGHANISTAN A CANADIAN STORY 2001-2014* are presented to illustrate the magnitude and impact of the sacrifices and achievements of Canada's military on society at large as well as positioning Canada's as a valued and respected player on the world stage.
